The Masai people are a strongly independent people who value tradition and ritual as an integral part of their everyday lives. Lions and Wildebeest play as important a role in their cultural beliefs as their own herds of cattle. This unique co-existence of man and wildlife makes this Masai land one of the world's most unique wilderness regions. At the heart of these lands is the Masai Mara Game Reserve, widely considered to be Africa's greatest wildlife reserve.
